

## **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE'S REPORT 2025**

**(AS ADOPTED AT THE 2025 AGM ON 16<sup>th</sup> JUNE 2026)**

### **Society Matters**

The Objects of the Society are:

- **To promote high standards of planning and architecture in, or affecting the area of benefit, which is the civil parish of Whaley Bridge.**
- **To stimulate public interest in, and care for the beauty, history, and character of this area, and its surroundings.**
- **To secure the preservation, protection, development and improvement of features of historic or public interest in the area of benefit.**

Owing to the unavailability of volunteers and the temporary closure of the Mechanics' Institute for building works, it has unfortunately again not been possible to hold any coffee mornings since the last AGM.

This year, we have been unable to hold a meeting of the Executive Committee, but a site visit has been made by members of the Executive Committee in connection with the funding programme (see below).

Sadly, the membership of the Society continues to decline, owing to which it is becoming increasingly difficult to continue the full range of the Society's activities. Over the years, many of the functions of the Society have been taken over by new groups which have been formed for specific purposes. Therefore, on completion of the distribution of our funds through the funding programme (see below), we will formally review the feasibility of the Society's continued operation, and identify any functional gaps which may be left if the Society were to be wound-up. The membership will, of course, be fully involved in any resulting decisions.

### **Funding Programme**

As we reported previously, the programme of distributing the Society's funds which were raised from the sale of the Club Room in 2023 has continued. The programme was devised for funding projects benefiting the residents of the civil parish of Whaley Bridge (which is the Society's area of benefit), including the wards of Fernilee, Furness Vale, Taxal and Yeadsley.

To recap, expressions of interest were received from several organisations in the civil parish and considered by the Executive Committee, resulting in the award of the following grants:

- Whaley Bridge Community Trust (Footsteps) for a replacement lift: £26,900(complete). A further sum of £1,400 was approved at the AGM for 2024, towards a project to move an air conditioning / heating inverter unit, but this has not yet been claimed.

- Furness Vale COGS for additional drainage at the sports field in Furness Vale: £6,000 allocated. (Just over half the grant had been paid as at 30<sup>th</sup> August 2025.)
- Furness Vale Community Association and Social Club for improvements to their building: £28,000. (Several stage payments, amounting to just over half the grant have been paid as at 31<sup>st</sup> August 2025). A further sum of £800 was approved at the AGM for 2024, towards high level painting work.
- First Taxal Scout Group for improvements to their scout hut and access: £15,000 allocated (areas for funding discussed at a site visit in July 2025).

Total funds allocated: £78,100.

We anticipate that the funds will have been largely distributed within the next year.

### **Toddbrook Reservoir**

The Canal and River Trust's construction of a new spillway for Toddbrook Reservoir is now largely complete, following the emergency in 2019. As at May 2026, this has been followed by the removal of the old auxiliary spillway and grass-seeding of the exposed embankment, and the re-filling of the reservoir in controlled stages has begun. The Society will continue to monitor progress.

### **High Peak Local Plan**

As we indicated in our previous reports, High Peak Borough Council (HPBC) has embarked on a review of its Local Plan, which was adopted in 2016, to cover planning matters in the borough outside the Peak District National Park, in the period until 2031. Circumstances have changed and it has been determined that the Local Plan needs to be updated. The new Plan will cover the period to 2041.

The UK Government published a new National Planning Policy Framework in December 2024 and in response, HPBC has produced an updated Local Development Scheme (LDS), which has been published on its website (see <https://www.highpeak.gov.uk/article/853/Local-Development-Scheme>).

The LDS includes the development of the Local Plan and contains a timetable of events, which includes the early engagement phase of 2023, followed by a Preferred Options Consultation in the spring of 2025. The results of this have been published on the HPBC website in two large pdf documents at:

The Proposed Submission Consultation was due in the winter of 2025, with adoption of the Local Plan aimed at the autumn of 2026 (it was previously expected during mid-2026). The timescales appear to have slipped.

Changes in the revised Local Plan may have implications on the associated Neighbourhood Plans, and in particular on that for Whaley Bridge, which was adopted in 2024, and it may need to be revised as a consequence.

The Society will maintain a watching brief on these matters and will make contributions where appropriate.
